Adventure Shakespeare is a thrilling 12-week afterschool enrichment program that brings the magic of the Bard to life for students. Through a lively blend of performance, visual art, and collaboration, students step into Shakespeare's world—learning to speak the language, embody the characters, and tell timeless stories with confidence and flair. This program makes Shakespeare fun, accessible, and meaningful, inviting young people to discover their voice and creativity both onstage and off.

Throughout the course, students work together to rehearse and perform a real Shakespeare play, adapted to be engaging and age-appropriate. Along the way, they master the art of storytelling through expressive speech and movement, learn basic choreography and safe stage combat, and build public speaking skills that foster stage presence and poise. The ensemble-based structure nurtures teamwork, while hands-on activities in costume, prop, and set design ignite artistic expression.

Each session is packed with opportunities for students to grow in confidence, develop their imagination, and connect with their peers. From sword fights and soliloquies to painting props and crafting costumes, every element of the program is designed to inspire joy, collaboration, and self-discovery. The experience culminates in a full-scale production of an abridged version of the selected play for the school, families, and the extended community—an unforgettable celebration of the students' hard work, talent, and creative courage.

ADVENTURE SHAKESPEARE PROVIDES

Program Initiation

 Artistic Directors and Program Administrators meet with the school administrator and Liaison Teacher in late summer to select the play and review the program timeline.

Adaption of Text

 Each student receives an edited script, abridged to approximately 45 minutes. The script preserves original themes and Elizabethan language, but is adapted to suit students' grade.

Workshops & Rehearsals

- Twelve weeks of twiceweekly sessions (September through November), including workshops, auditions, and rehearsals (schedule is flexible).
- Guest Teaching Artists are arranged for specialty sessions (e.g., set design).

Production Assets

- Costumes, music, sets, and props are provided. These elements are designed, built, and performed by Adventure Shakespeare students under the guidance of Adventure Shakespeare Artistic Directors and/or Guest Artists.
- Lighting and sound equipment will be provided if the school's facilities are unavailable.

 Typically, we collaborate with schools to utilize their existing lighting and sound systems.
- Full technical setup, execution, and strike included.

Final Presentation

Two school-day performances for classmates and staff, plus one evening performance for families.



WHAT THE SCHOOL PROVIDES

Principal Support

- Provide program funding.
- Embrace the identity of the school as a producing entity.
- Select a Liaison Teacher or Parent Volunteer.
- Designate a dedicated rehearsal space twice a week (ideally an auditorium).
- · Provide internet access.
- 10–25 participating students.
- Promote participation and a love of theater.

Liaison Teacher Support

- Collect parental consent forms.
- Attend workshops.
- Monitor attendance and discipline.
- Act as liaison with school staff, families, and teaching artists.
- Offer administrative help (e.g., copies, materials, snacks).

Custodial Support

- Ensure rehearsal space is ready before each session.
- Provide secure storage for props and costumes.
- Assist with seating, backdrop setup, and general tasks during tech/production week.

Parent Community Support

- Support student script reading at home.
- Encourage attendance and participation.
- Volunteer where possible (e.g., hair and makeup).

PROGRAM COSTS TO SCHOOL

- \$6,000.00 Stipend for two Artistic Directors, program administration, and production materials.
- TBD Stipend for participating Liaison Teacher and/or Parent Volunteer, if needed.
